Dear Friends,

Let's face it: FY09 was a pretty difficult year. The Dayton area suffered through seemingly daily announcements of job losses and budget cuts. The nation plunged into a deep recession. Instead of focusing on the challenges of this past year, I want to tell you about some good things that happened during FY09:

- Project READ helped 959 adults select a free GED, reading, family literacy or English language class offered by Project READ coalition members in the Dayton area.
- Project READ engaged 424 volunteers as reading tutors for children or adults.
- 1,979 elementary and middle school students received reading tutoring through Project READ's Miami Valley READS program and the latest assessment study revealed that 93% of tutored students within the sample improved their reading skills from pre-test to post-test.
- 576 children and adults were instructed by Literacy*AmeriCorps Dayton service members at nine coalition member programs as well as at Project READ.
- Project READ planned or participated in 27 community events, bringing the literacy message to nearly 11,000 people.
- Project READ distributed nearly 6,500 books during FY09, most donated by local booksellers and local book distributor Look at a Book.

In tough times, Project READ is there to help adults and children improve their literacy skills for a brighter future. I would like to thank our volunteers, donors, and business and foundation supporters who gave to us so that we can pursue our mission. Your support helps us to build a community of readers.

Key Programs

- Project READ operates a literacy Helpline that links approximately 1,000 adults each year with free GED, reading, family literacy and English language classes and hundreds of volunteers with programs and schools in need of reading tutors for adults and youth
- Project READ distributes thousands of new and gently used books each year to local literacy programs and directly to families in need
- Project READ manages the Miami Valley READS program, which recruits, trains and places hundreds of volunteers with 66 school and community partners to tutor youth in reading
- Project READ directs the Literacy*AmeriCorps Dayton program, which places up to 10 service members in coalition member programs to serve as literacy instructors and tutors for adults and youth
- Project READ coordinates the Adult Literacy Services program, which provides literacy instruction to low-income adults

State of Literacy in the Miami Valley 2009

Project READ continually monitors the state of literacy in the Miami Valley to determine the community's need for services. The latest statistics tell us that there are still many people in the Dayton area that need literacy assistance:

- 22.6% of Ohio third graders failed the most recent reading achievement test, including 44.7% of Dayton Public Schools third graders (2008-2009 Ohio Department of Education Local Report Card).
- 28% of Ohio fifth graders failed the most recent reading achievement test, including 64.4% of Dayton Public Schools fifth graders (2008-2009 Ohio Department of Education Local Report Card).
- 34% of individuals age 16 and older had difficulty reading and understanding information in simple documents. Based on these results, local adult educators believe that approximately 147,000 adults in Montgomery County, 41,000 adults in Greene County, and 11,000 adults in Preble County have limited literacy skills. (National Assessment of Adult Literacy, December 2005).
- Nationally, one in three young adults—more than 1.2 million people—drop out of high school every year. (Reach Higher America: Overcoming Crisis in the U.S. Workforce, June 2008)



Serving Learners and Volunteers

Helpline

Project READ's Helpline service individually matches adult learners with free GED, reading, family literacy and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) classes in the Dayton area. In FY09, 959 adult learners received referrals to educational programs by calling the Project READ Helpline number: (937) 461-READ.

Project READ also serves as a clearinghouse for literacy volunteer opportunities in the Miami Valley. In FY09, 32 volunteers were referred to the Miami Valley Literacy Council and programs in surrounding counties to become adult literacy volunteers. In addition, 128 new volunteers chose to become reading tutors for youth in our Miami Valley READS program schools and tutoring sites.

Miami Valley READS



Miami Valley READS, a program of Project READ, recruits, trains and places volunteer reading tutors to provide one-on-one assistance to struggling readers in 66 local schools and community tutoring sites. Miami Valley READS also recognizes tutors with holiday cards and certificates to enhance volunteer retention and provides technical assistance to school and community partners.

During FY09, 128 new volunteers were recruited by Miami Valley READS, local businesses, and/or by the schools themselves. In all, 392 volunteers tutored in 66 Miami Valley READS schools and community tutoring sites during the 2008-2009 school year. These volunteers tutored 1,979 elementary and middle school students in reading.

During FY09, Miami Valley READS offered in-house volunteer training for the first time. The Education Programs Coordinator, Holly Elkins, trained 76 volunteers during the year for service as tutors. Miami Valley READS also extended its successful partnership with book distributor Look at a Book, which culminated in the distribution of 4,000 new books to Miami Valley READS partners in May 2009.

Miami Valley READS tutoring programs are a critical component in achieving reading success for Dayton-area youth. In order to measure reading skill gain, an independent, third-party consultant analyzes data collected from a sample of participating schools and compiles the results into a comprehensive report. The most recent study analyzed data collected after the 2007-2008 school year. The consultant's conclusions are detailed below:

- 93% of tutored students in the sample improved their test score performance from pre- to post-test.
- All of the schools that submitted data for the study demonstrated a moderate or large effect size, meaning that tutoring had a moderate or large effect on student reading gain.
- On average, tutored students within the Miami Valley READS Program demonstrated a statistically significant improvement in their pre-test to post-test scores regardless of test type, grade level, school, and classroom teaching practices.

Combined with results from five previous assessment studies, Miami Valley READS was found to produce a positive average gain from pre- to post-test across all different test types for all six academic years considered (2002-2003; 2003-2004; 2004-2005; 2005-2006; 2006-2007; 2007-2008).

Literacy*AmeriCorps Dayton

Project READ entered its sixth Literacy*AmeriCorps Dayton grant year in October 2008. During the 2008-2009 Service Year, nine full-time service members instructed hundreds of adults and children in the Dayton area. Literacy*AmeriCorps Dayton service members provided the following services to local learners:

- Service members taught 381 adults in Adult Basic Education, English for Speakers of Other Languages, GED classes or basic skills development.
- Service members tutored 195 youth in reading.

Due to the skilled instruction of Literacy*AmeriCorps members, learners experienced tremendous achievement during the year:

- 75% of adult learners pre- and post-tested with the TABE showed at least a ten-point gain.
- 82% of adult learners evaluated with the BEST Plus test exhibited at least a 10 point increase from pre- to post-test.
- 21 adult learners earned their GED.

Literacy*AmeriCorps Dayton members strongly impacted the community with book distribution and outreach activities during 2008-2009. Service members participated in 11 community events during the 2008-2009 service year, distributing more than 1,200 flyers or brochures and reaching nearly 10,000 people with the literacy message. Project READ also distributed thousands of books during the service year. The collection, sorting and distribution of these donated books were often coordinated by AmeriCorps service members. Finally, Literacy*AmeriCorps Dayton service members recruited 50 special event volunteers who contributed 400 hours of service to the community.

Adult Literacy Services Program

The Adult Literacy Services Program is a collaboration between Project READ, the Miami Valley Literacy Council, Dayton Public Schools, Miami Valley Career Technology Center, and Kettering City Schools' Office of Community Literacy Programs. The program serves Prevention, Retention and Contingency (PRC) eligible adults in need of literacy assistance. During calendar year 2008, the following outcomes were achieved:

- 132 PRC eligible adults were instructed for a total of 3,649 hours
- 75.56% of students achieved progress as evidenced by either pre/post test scores on a standardized test or their Ohio Department of Education mandated Annual Portfolio review. The majority of student's improvement was documented through the standardized testing.
- 80% of students enrolled in the program for one year achieved a long term goal, such as obtaining a job or improving literacy skills to a certain level.

The Adult Literacy Services Program is funded by Montgomery County Job and Family Services. The current contract expires December 31, 2009, with an option to renew.



Project READ Community Outreach & Events

Target READING Festival 2009

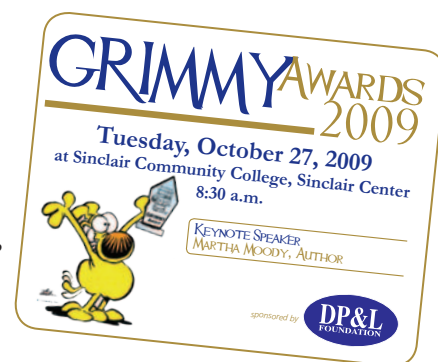
The 2009 Target READING Festival was held on Saturday, March 28, in Wayne High School's gymnasium. The event brought together reading and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math). A number of community partners collaborated:

- Boonshoft Museum of Discovery (rocket and robot activities)
- Dayton Metro Library (math activities and STEM-focused reading lists and books)
- Good Samaritan Hospital (health sciences)
- K12 Gallery for Young People (make and take art activity with old computer parts)
- National Museum of the United States Air Force (gravity and flight)
- Think TV (activities focused on sound and space)

Each of these community partners had numerous STEM-focused activities where the children, as well as adults, could participate in a very hands-on way. Additional partners included the Huber Heights school district office, which donated bottled water and cookies for all participants, and local restaurants and businesses that contributed door prizes to the event. Over 250 children attended the event and received at least two new books each due to Target's sponsorship.

GRIMMY Awards

The 2008 GRIMMY Awards and a celebration of Project READ's 20th anniversary were held on Wednesday, October 29th at Sinclair's Conference Center. Presenting sponsor for the event was Premier Health Partners, Miami Valley Hospital / Good Samaritan Hospital. The GRIMMY Awards recognize outstanding volunteers, students and supporters of literacy programs in the Miami Valley. Recipients of 2008 GRIMMY Awards were:

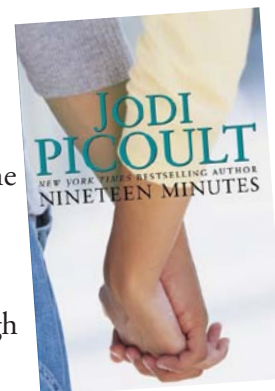

The Big Read

The Dayton area's community reading project, the Big Read is a collaborative effort between Books & Co., local libraries, universities, schools, community agencies, the Dayton Daily News, and Project READ. Local libraries, bookstores and other locations held events and book discussions relating to the selected book: *Nineteen Minutes* by Jodi Picoult. Hundreds of fans turned out to hear Picoult discuss her work and have books signed during an event at Books & Co. in March. The Big Read concluded with an emotional event featuring Nicole Nowlen, a student who was wounded in the Columbine High School shooting of 1999.



Time Warner Cable Concert for Literacy

The 2009 Time Warner Cable Concert for Literacy featured the return of hometown hero and Simpsons voice actress, Nancy Cartwright, and the rocking sounds of Leroy Ellington and the E-Funk Band. On a beautifully cool summer evening, Nancy took the stage first and got the crowd laughing with a history of her life in Kettering and beyond, complete with comments from her favorite characters including Bart Simpson and Ralph Wiggum from *The Simpsons* and Chuckie from *Rugrats*. Nancy even held a Simpsons trivia contest on stage, with the winner taking home an autographed Bart Simpson t-shirt. Then Cincinnati-based Leroy Ellington and the E-Funk Band took the stage and played rock favorites from the last two decades, as well as some classic rhythm and blues, funk and soul.

Additional concert sponsorship was provided by Town & Country Shopping Center and Heidelberg Distributing Company. Dozens of businesses donated raffle prizes and Krispy Kreme Doughnuts gave away free Simpsons-themed doughnuts to all attendees. When the night was over, the concert raised over \$4,000 for Project READ! Thanks again to everyone that made the event possible through ticket purchases, raffle donations, volunteer hours and event sponsorship.

Voyage on the Parkway

The first "Voyage on the Parkway," an event focusing on the importance of preparing young children for kindergarten and beyond, was held on October 10, 2008. Project READ, along with community partners Five Rivers MetroParks, the Boonshoft Museum of Discovery and ReadySetSoar, coordinated the free outdoor event that was attended by over 1,200 children and their families. At least a dozen other community education partners hosted "learning tents" where attendees of all ages took part in numerous activities such as "Take a Trip," "Read With Each Other," "Play Rhyming Games" and more.



RTA provided trolley rides, K12 Gallery for Young People provided a make and take art activity, and all the adults went home with information about preparing their children for school, reading activities to do at home, and contact information for dozens of community agencies and organizations that provide services and activities for growing families. The event was so successful that it will be repeated in the fall of 2009 and will also include a book giveaway coordinated by Project READ.
